

11th Research Symposium of the Faculty of Management Studies and Commerce

The 11th Faculty Research Symposium of the Faculty of Management Studies and Commerce (FMSC), University of Sri Jayewardenepura, one of the noteworthy events in the academic calendar of the FMSC was held on 19th August 2016. The key objective of this semi-annual symposium is to create an opportunity beyond the department level for the established and young academics to share their research findings and experiences with each other to enhance the understanding among the academics with diverse expertise while promoting an intradisciplinary and interdisciplinary research culture in the FMSC. Prof. Sampath Amaratunge who was the initiator of this symposium being then the Dean of FMSC, participated as the Chief Guest and Dr. Anura Kumara, the present Dean of the FMSC, took part as the Guest of Honour. Dr. Lasith Gunawardhana delivered the keynote speech, which was followed by research presentations of the FMSC academics. For the first time in the history of this symposium, an e-version of the symposium prospectus was launched. Dr. Dushar Dayarathne and Dr. Roshan Ajward were the co-chairs of this 11th FMSC symposium.

The College of Biochemists Sri Lanka (CBSL) together with the Federation of Asian and Oceanian Biochemists and Molecular Biologists (FAOBMB) and the University of Sri Jayewardenepura successfully conducted a symposium on "Biochemistry: Towards Academic Excellence" on the 22nd of June 2016 at the Golden Rose Hotel, Boralesgamuwa, with an audience of academics and researchers from Universities and research institutions in Sri Lanka numbering one hundred. This provided a valuable opportunity to all Sri Lankan scientists, working in the field of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology to learn the new advancements in the field and broaden their knowledge.

In addition to the symposium, the council meeting of FAOBMB was held on the 21st of June 2016 at Hotel OZO, Colombo. Bilateral research discussions were held on the 23rd June and 24th June at the University of Sri Jayewardenepura and the University of Colombo.

Global Conference on Entomology 2016

The Global Conference on Entomology, organized jointly by the University of Sri Jayawardenepura and the Century Foundation was held from 22nd August to the 24th August 2016 at Hotel Galadari, Colombo, Sri Lanka. The major objective of the 3rd Global Conference on Entomology was to showcase recent advances in research and development in the insect world. Prof Sandun Senarath, (Head, Dept. of Botany), Prof M. M. Pathmalal (Head, Dept. of Zoology), Dr S. Karunaratna and Dr Rupika Perera of University of Sri Jayawardenepura were members of the organizing committee of the conference.



21st International Forestry and Environmental Symposium 2016

The "21st International Forestry and Environmental Symposium 2016" organized by the Department of Forestry and Environmental Science, was held on the 23rd and 24th of September 2016 at Heritance Kandalama, Dambulla. The Hon. Susil Premjayatha, the Minister of Science Technology and Research was the Chief Guest of the event. The symposium was chaired by Dr. Prasanthi Gunawardena, Head, Department of Forestry and Environmental Science, and Dr. Priyan Perera was the coordinator of the 21st International Forestry and Environment Symposium. Over 150 new research findings were published in this forum. The Symposium was attended by over 400 local and foreign participants including key government officials, academics, researchers and business leaders in Forestry and Environment sectors. The Keynote addresses were delivered by Prof. David Newsome, Murdoch University, Western Australia and Prof. Richard Vlosky, Louisiana State University, USA.

Faculty of Medical Sciences – Local Academic Partner of the 2nd International Conference on Public Health (ICOPH2016)

The seminar was held on the 16th of May 2016, at the University premises. Students of all the three batches took part in this and received exposure to the applications of Economics in the real world.

Dr. Chandrakumara graduated from the University of Peradeniya where he earned his Bachelor of Arts degree specializing in Economics. He was appointed as a lecturer in Economics in this university in 1989. He obtained his Master of Arts Degree from the University of Kerala in 1993 and doctorate from the University of Sri Jayewardenepura with training from both Goteborg and Uppsala Universities in Sweden. His major areas of research are 'education and human capital', 'micro-credit', 'community governance' and 'economic analysis of environmental issues'. He has also been involved with a number of institutions as a research consultant in their development or evaluation projects. He has made his presentations in many international conferences in and outside Sri Lanka. He has held positions as either chairman or member of many committees appointed for special or developmental tasks of the university, also serving other national universities and institutions as a visiting lecturer or resource person.

ශ්‍රී ජයවර්ධනපුර විශ්වවිද්‍යාලයේ ඉතිහාස හා පුරාවිද්‍යා අධ්‍යයනාංශය පුරාවිද්‍යා දෙපාර්තමේන්තුව සමග ඒකාබද්ධව 2012 වර්ෂයේ දී ආරම්භ කළ අමීපාර රජගල පුරාවිද්‍යා ව්‍යාපෘති භූමියෙහි පසුගිය දිනවලදී කරන ලද පුරාවිද්‍යා කැණීම්වලින් අනුරාධපුර යුගයට අයත් පිළිම ගෙයක සාදක හමුවිය. ඉදිකිරීම් අංග සමුදායකින් යුතු රජගල පුරාවිද්‍යා භූමියෙහි කඳු මුදුනේ ඉදිකර ඇති අනෙකුත් ඉදිකිරීම් අතර මෙම පිළිමගෙය ඉදිකොට තිබුණි. නිදන් භාරුන්ගේ බරපතල හානිකරීම්වලට එහි දොරටු සංකීර්ණය ලක්ව තිබූ අතර මුරගල්, සඳකඩපහණ, පියගැට පෙළ ආදී වටිනා පුරාවිද්‍යාත්මක අවශේෂ සියල්ලම පාහේ කඩා බිඳ දමා තිබුණි. වාසනාවකට මෙන් පිළිමගෙය ඇතුළත කොටස මෙම විනාශකාරීත්වයේ හානිකරීම්වලට ලක් වී නොතිබුණු බැවින් කැණීම් කිරීමේදී අනුරාධපුර සමයෙහි මධ්‍ය භාගයේ පමණ පිහිටුවන ලදැයි සිතිය හැකි පද්මපීඨයක් සහිත ගල් පුවරුවක් සොයා ගැනීමට හැකිවිය.

තෙවැනි මලක හැඩයගත් මෙම පද්මපීඨයෙහි මැද සිදුරු දෙකක් ගල තුළට භාරා ඇති බැවින් ලංකාවේ වෙනත් ස්ථානවලදී ලද සාදක අනුව එහි ශිලාමය හෝ දාරුමය හිටි බුදුපිළිමයක් තැම්පත් කර තිබෙන්නට ඇතැයි සැලකීමට හැකිය. පාදස්තලය සහිත මෙම ගල් පුවරුව ආරක්ෂාකාරී ලෙස පුරාවිද්‍යා නිලධාරීන් ඉදිරියේදී කැණීම්කර නිරාවරණය කොට ගල් පුවරුව යට පරීක්ෂා කිරීමේ පතුලට ගඩොල් කැටයකුත් ඒ වටා සතර පැත්තෙහි තවත් ගඩොල් කැට හතරක් තැම්පත්කොට, ඒ මතු පිට ගඩොල් කැට දෙකකින් වසා පූර්ණ ලෙස ආවරණය කොට සරල මංජුසාවක් සකසාගෙන තිබුණි. මෙය ස්ථිර වශයෙන්ම බුදුපිළිමය එහි තැම්පත් කිරීමට පෙර කරන ලද අභිවාරාත්මක තැම්පතුවක් බව පෙනී ගියහෙයින් ගඩොල් කැට දෙකින් යුතු පියහ ඉවත්කොට ඇතුළත පස් සියුම්ව ඉවත් කිරීමේදී ඒ තුළ මධ්‍ය ප්‍රමාණයේ හක්ගෙඩියක් තැම්පත්කර තිබී හමුවිය. බෙහෙවින් දිරාපත් වී තිබූ හක්ගෙඩිය හැරුණුවිට එහි වෙනත් කිසිදු වස්තුවක් දැකගත නොහැකිවිය. මේවා පූජා වස්තූන් ලෙස සලකා අදින් වසර 1400 කට පමණ පෙර එහි තැම්පත් කරන්නට ඇතැයි ගොඩනැගිල්ලෙහි වාස්තු විද්‍යාත්මක ඉදිකිරීම් ලක්ෂණ අනුව හා වෙනත් ඉදිකිරීම් සමග සාපේක්ෂව සැසඳීමේදී තීරණය කළ හැකිවිය. පැරණි ප්‍රතිමාවලත් දැගැබවලත් මහා ධන නිධාන තැම්පත්කොට ඇතැයි සිතා අපගේ උරුමය විනාශ කරන්නන්හට මෙම තැම්පතුව හොඳ පණිවිඩයක් ලබාදෙන බව සඳහන් කළහැකිය.




Establishment of the Department of Criminology and Criminal Justice.

B.Sc Estate Management and Valuation Degree evaluation specified in RICS – UK accreditation



Professor Ali Parsa, Dean of the Faculty of Real Estate and Land Management, Royal Agricultural University, United Kingdom, visited the Department of Estate Management and Valuation during 04 - 06 May 2016 to evaluate the B.Sc. Estate Management and Valuation Degree programme (EMV Degree) as an external examiner. This is a mandatory evaluation as per the recommendation made by the RICS-UK as its accreditation to the B.Sc. Estate Management and Valuation Degree programme. The B.Sc. Estate Management and Valuation (Special) degree offered by the Department of Estate Management and Valuation, Faculty of Management Studies and Commerce, is the first and the sole land base higher education programme in Sri Lanka in the field of Real Estate Management and Valuation. This degree programme has been accredited by the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors (RICS – UK) since 2015. EMV graduates are eligible to get full membership of the RICS once they fulfill the Assessment of Professional Competence (APC) as prescribed by the RICS.

BDO partners, Chartered accountants and the Department of Accounting (DA) of the Faculty of Management Studies and Commerce, made and entered into a Memorandum of Understanding on 10th June 2016.



Department of Entrepreneurship gets an honorary adjunct faculty member from China

Impact Assessment studies by the Center for Sustainability

The Center for Sustainability of the Department of Forestry and Environmental Science has been awarded the contract of providing consultancy services to conduct an Environment Impact Assessment for the Reinstatement of the Kudawilachchiya Tank in the Anuradhapura District by the Department of Irrigation, Sri Lanka.

It has also been asked to conduct an Impact Assessment Study of Sustainable Agriculture Network (Rain-forest Alliance) Certification on Sri Lanka's Tea Estates by Unilever Sri Lanka Limited. The objective of the study is to evaluate and validate measurable economic, social and environmental benefits in adopting SAN certification. Dr. Priyan Perera of the Department of Forestry and Environmental Science is leading the project.



ELTU- Social Responsibility Programme II

The second programme to improve English proficiency in a chosen sector of society was done by the English Language Teaching Unit at the invitation of the Bodhi Maga Padanama of the Kaluthara Bodhi Trust and the English Language Professionals' Association, at the Kaluthara Bodhi Temple premises on September 24th.

This was an interactive programme involving 15 English teachers of Dhamma schools and 10 lecturers from the ELTU. This was a workshop which explored new ways of teaching English - through meditation and literature; through music and singing; through language games and drama, for example. Workshops were conducted by the organizer of the outreach programmes, Karunesena Lokumudali, the Head, ELTU, Sarath Ananda and visiting lectures.

Under its social responsibility initiative, the ELTU did its first programme involving school students in the Rathnapura zonal area of education on 24th September 2015 in the Meneripitiya Resource Center of the Ministry of Education.



Research Collaboration between the Department of Computer Science and Shibaura Institute of Technology



A Global Project Based Learning (GBPL) program will be established between the Department of Computer Science and the Shibaura Institute of Technology, Tokyo, Japan, from year 2017. The goal of GBPL is to exchange and share knowledge based on joint projects conducted between the students of the Department of Computer Science and students of the Department of Electronic Engineering, Shibaura Institute of Technology. Dean of Faculty Applied Sciences, senior researcher, Professor Chinthaka Premachandra and students from the Department of Electronic Engineering, Shibaura Institute of Technology, Head, Academic Staff and students from the Department of Computer Science, were present for the initial workshop that was held on 31st, August, 2016, at the Faculty of Postgraduate Studies.

Workshops for Music Students

Two workshops were held for the students of music at the Department of Languages, Cultural Studies and Performing Arts. On 24th June, students were fortunate to have famous Indian classical violinist Professor V Balaji conduct a workshop and give a concert of classical music afterwards, at the Sumangala Reading Hall. Professor Balaji is the former Dean of the Faculty of Performing Arts of Benares University, India. All teachers and students of music attended this event.

On 11th July, students of folk music were given a workshop on the music the "Kolam" drama style connected to southern Sri Lanka. A traditional troupe of Kolam performers lead by Tukka Vadu Harishchandra Gurunnase conducted this day long workshop at "Sandella" in the Sumangala building.



Development of a Vocational Education and Training (VET) Plan for the Environmental Protection Sector in Sri Lanka

The Center for Sustainability has successfully completed the development of a Vocational Education and Training (VET) Plan for the Environmental Protection Sector, for the Tertiary and Vocational Training Commission (TVEC), Sri Lanka. The report identified current and future trends in "Green Jobs" in the country, and proposed a training plan to address skill shortages in the labour market.



EMV Students Association - CSR Project

Estate Management and Valuation Students Association and the EMV staff organized an educational program for the students in Madurakatiya Kanista Vidyalaya in Monaragala on 18th July, 2016, at the Department of Estate Management and Valuation. Around 100 school children, teachers and parents participated in this event. Resource persons from the Department of Human Resource Management, Department of Marketing Management, Department of Entrepreneurship and the National Dangerous Drugs Control Board Sri Lanka contributed.

Dr. S.C. Paul Memorial Oration given by Dr Chandima Jeewandara




Vesak at Japura


A Community Project – the Renovation of Imbulgoda Kanishta Vidyalaya

11. News Feature

Professor Sunethra Weerakoon



Senior Professor Sunethra Weerakoon with her students Dr. Sirani K. Perera, Kusal Madhushankha, Isanka Udayanga and Dr. Menaka Liyanage.

We carry a profile on Professor Sunethra Weerakoon today in whose name the International Industrial Mathematics Conference of the University of Sri Jayewardenepura was held from 3rd to 5th June 2016. She will bring an illustrious career to an end as she retires from the university on 31st December 2016.

Sometimes you watch a person and think – in the words of Arundathy Roy - there is a story here.

This had occurred to me a couple of times as I had glanced at Professor Sunethra Weerakoon in and around the University of Sri Jayewardenepura. She is a Professor in the Department of Mathematics, Faculty of Applied Sciences, the first in the country to have been made Professor of Mathematics on merit, and the first female in Sri Lanka to get a PhD in this subject.

The reasons are many

– tales I had heard from others: she wore white saree for years to mark the death of a university student due to a fight over ragging; she fights fiercely in Faculty Boards; a colleague says with a wistfulness, 'There are not many teachers like her, who has the interest of students paramount in her heart. When she retires, that loss will be hard to fill.'

– what I had seen: the tension palpably quivers on her slight figure as she sits in on a seminar on gender violence, she gets up to hand out a photocopied newspaper article on ragging to the participants; she does a quick walk to Wijerama Junction, a handloom saree worn absolutely correctly the Kandyan way clearly visible among the crowds, head down, intensely focused on her direction on her way home every evening

– what I have experienced: a furious voice in my ear when she thinks we have not been fair by those students of her faculty who are weak in English. Even during that very loud interaction on the phone – when her voice breaks to say that shouting is not going to get anything done – I think, "There is a story here."

Since Professor Weerakoon's remarkable official career ended with her retirement at the end of December 2016, there is a chance to say it and have others know of this remarkable woman. With her story that starts in 1951 when she was born, we are also allowed quick glimpses into our country's past – coloured snapshots flit by as she speaks.

"I was the ninth of ten children. So I remember my parents as old people. We lived in Badulla, in the village of Medapathana. My father was from Kalutara but we never went to the South. We were never taken to his home. No one explained why clearly. But if I were to put two and two together, perhaps I can come up with this: My mother was very beautiful. She was from Ratnapura. She had never gone to school. She learnt to read from my father. She learnt to sign from me. Perhaps why we were never taken to his home in Kalutara is because he didn't want to expose her to ridicule.

My mother was a very hard worker. All her children studied well and did brilliantly in school. We never had much money and it was often a problem to have all our needs met. My father dabbled in business for some time but that did not flourish because I do not think he was cut out for business. He had brains and he was tough. He was good with books. He brought down lessons from Germany and learnt homeopathy and became a doctor. But he was always strongly oriented towards politics. He always wanted to do something for the people. He founded both the SLFP and the UNP in Badulla and became their organizer – his political involvement was such.

I started my education in 1956. There were very posh schools in Badulla, but we could not afford them. So all of us went to a Sinhala medium school that was called 'Welagedera Iskole'. What I remember about this was how good the teachers were. They were an organized methodical group that did very well by the students and I got a very good education in this school. No tuition or extra coaching was heard of then. The school had only a few buildings so the nursery and the higher grades

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met in the morning. The primary school had classes in the afternoon. Even in conditions like these, we were not short of anything education-wise, there was even sports.

I was always first in class – like most of my siblings – but I do not remember studying when I was small. There was plenty of space around us – the land was about one and a half acres where we lived. There were guava trees in the garden and I was on top of them most of the time. We did not have many toys. The ‘kolapatha’ – the stem of the arecanut palm was our badminton racquet. The shuttlecock was the ‘daspetiya’ flower.

In 1964 there was a reorganization of schools. St Bead’s, a private school a short distance away was amalgamated to the Welegedera Iskole and the whole, turned into Badulla Maha Vidyalaya. Students from the whole area came here now for the higher grades. Only two were qualified from the whole school to do Science for the A/Levels. I was one of them.

But there was no Science stream available for A/Levels where I was. But by then my siblings could support me - my oldest brother was 24 years my senior. They gave me the means to go to Mahamaya College in Kandy. I did everything extracurricular there as well. I was a sprinter, a dancer, a debater. But I managed to get an A for my A/Levels which was not so common then as it is now. I got into the Peradeniya Engineering Faculty, which at that time was the leading center for engineering.

I was never really interested in Engineering. And also there was a scholarship on offer for a ‘pure science’ student. So I applied for it and got it. My financial problems were solved. There was Rs. 100 given a month and that was enough for me even to have some savings left. I went to university in 1972.

There was first an Intensive Course in English for the majority of students at Peradeniya. That is how I know how important that course is for students who came from backgrounds that had no exposure to that language. I was not so badly off because my father had known English but it wasn’t so for everyone. It also helped that the first year had both Sinhala and Tamil medium courses along with the English medium ones, so that students had a chance of sitting in on everything and getting used to the language. There was no division then between those who knew English and those who didn’t know it very much. That mixing was such a useful and effective way of improving one’s proficiency in the language. This doesn’t happen now and I worry about the students who have to struggle with the language while struggling with new subject matter.

I was chosen to do a special in both Maths and Chemistry and chose to do maths. And when I passed out, I taught at Peradeniya for some time before coming to Colombo and joining Vidyodaya Campus, which our university was called then, as a probationary lecturer. My marriage was to a Peradeniya Engineering graduate.


My first idea was to do my postgraduate studies here. But the advice I got was that if I was to follow mathematics, the best would be to go abroad. So I applied to US universities and got into Pennsylvania State University and I went there as a Fulbright scholar. This was in 1979. My husband joined me after about a semester. The course there required that I learn two languages to be able to read journals in those languages.

So I learnt German and French. And also taught as a Teaching Assistant. By then I had children too. But since we lived in Graduate Housing and there were wives of graduate students there, there was plenty of child care available.

When we came back to Sri Lanka, five years later, we had two Masters Degrees, two PhDs, and two kids. I rejoined the University and my husband went on to become a professor at the Moratuwa University.

That was the time I got heavily involved in mainstream activities in the university. It was also the time that was called the Time of Terror – “Bheeshana Samaya”. I worked as the Joint Secretary in the organization called University Teachers for Human Rights. That was a time when intense political action was needed in the universities. The universities were anyway hotbeds of political activity.

That was not a good time. We had to look upon the dead bodies of our own students. I had to see so many people die. I do not believe that anything that calls for taking another’s life, is worth it.

From 1990, I stopped being in mainstream activity in the university. I realized that no matter what your own beliefs are, it is possible for one to get used for someone else’s ends. And I did not want to be used like that. So I restricted myself to peripheral activities.

I am a practicing Buddhist. I have taken sil every month even when I was school girl. I believe very strongly in the dhamma. So I have learnt to face many things with equanimity. And now, when I retire, I finally hope to invest some time on myself.”

At the end of the story of her personal journey, I will make just three interventions – to speak of her academic significance, to speak of her desire to fight injustice where ever she sees it and to see how she has managed the roles of being a woman with everything else. In each case, there is much she can teach us.

Professor Weerakoon started a pioneering MSc. Programme in Industrial Mathematics in her department in 1996. This provided a much needed course for Sri Lankan graduates, some of her students are now Professors of Mathematics themselves – both here and in the US. There are also many high ranking officials in various institutions who are students of hers. She is also the author of the first university level book of mathematics written in Sinhala – ‘Moolika Sankyathmaka Krama’ –Elementary Numerical Methods. This book greatly helped students who

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were struggling with English to tie over the initial months of English medium instruction.

It is not only to Sri Lanka that she has given of her knowledge. In each Sabbatical year, she has worked in well known universities, Curtin University of Technology in Australia, Cornell University and Texas A & M University, as a full fledged Professor of Mathematics.

Maths research is not something that is done very easily in this country and in fact, it had not been done in an effective way at all before the start of the MSc. Programme in Industrial Mathematics. But in the 50th Anniversary Celebrations of the University of Sri Jayewardenepura, Professor Weerakoon and her team won the Best Researcher Award of the Faculty of Applied Sciences. She also won the award for the Most Cited Scientist of the faculty. Research papers in Mathematics are the type that do not get cited much, but three of her papers, of two of which she is the sole author, have a record number of citations.

There are academics who go abroad for postgraduate studies and do not return home, the reason most given being the fact that they cannot put the knowledge thus gained to good use in Sri Lanka. Most of Professor Weerakoon's own batchmates, in fact, are currently working in foreign universities.

"When I was getting ready to come home after my PHD, my thesis advisor asked how much I would be getting as my salary. When I told him the amount – around eighty dollars at the time - he asked why on earth I was going back," says Professor Weerakoon. After serving two years in the Curtin University, Australia, on her sabbatical, she was informed that her position had been advertised and was requested to apply.

But her decision had always been to return home. Her desire had always been to serve where her service was most needed.

Perhaps her father's love of serving the people, his political slant, made Professor Weerakoon have this attitude. Also from him, perhaps, came her practice of speaking up against any form of injustice anywhere. Even at school she had walked into the principal's office to say that getting teachers to nominate the names for prefects was not fair when all this time the names had been picked by the votes of students. All she got was a reprimand and orders to march out, for her pains – but the desire of the girl to see justice done never left the woman she became.



This doesn't earn her popularity points – rarely does a woman fight and get admired for it but Professor Weerakoon dismisses popularity as irrelevant with the confidence of someone who knows of the level of reverence and faith she inspires in many. "I wrote an article some time ago on the question 'Is trade union action for increased salaries suitable for university lecturers?' I hung a photocopy of the article in the common room as no newspaper was willing to publish it given that it dealt with trade union action." Her eyes twinkle behind her glasses. "That didn't make me well liked."

During our conversation she tells me that heavy involvement in university work did not give her enough time for her own children. I ask where they are now and she says that her daughter got into MIT, USA – one of the leading universities in the world – at seventeen. She has a PhD from Oxford and is now an Assistant Professor at Cornell in Financial Economics. The sons went to CalTech (California Institute of Technology, again a leading research institution) and Cornell, also at a young age. Now, one has a PhD and the other has two Masters in Financial Engineering and Data Science. They had all got full scholarships to go there on their grades.

'All this without you having time for them?'

'Sometimes stepping back is a favour you do your children. Unless the path is going down. Then you should step in, as it is always easier to go down than up. Otherwise, it is good to remember that strong parents can create weak children.'

Strong, she is. She has seen a lot in her career that officially ends on 31st December 2016. Yet her desire to do service will probably not let her rest. She and her colleagues started a teaching course for students doing Combined Maths for their A/Levels on the university website. "I will probably help with this even after retirement," she says, as a matter of course.

This website at <http://learn.sjp.ac.lk/course/gce-al-combined-mathematics/> supervised by the highest team of lecturers at the Department of Mathematics was created so that, according to Professor Weerakoon, 'Students would know how to use their critical faculties while they are learning. This is what is not taught in tuition classes. This is our answer to the unwelcome tuition culture prevailing everywhere. Critical thinking is an important skill. Students need to activate it.'

That perhaps is our greatest need now - the creation not of unthinking rote learners but critical thinkers "When an individual cannot take a decision for himself or herself, that does not make a person worthy of anything," she says who has seen the harm that uncritical adherence to a doctrine can cause young lives.

Despite the prevalence of seemingly unquestioning acceptance of many wrongs in the country today, Professor Sunethra Weerakoon remains positive. "I still believe that Sri Lanka has good human resources. We are very rich in it. But I do not think that we are on the correct path. Our plans are not very good. But we can change. Indeed, we must, if we are to go make this country go forward."
